Located just blocks from downtown, Findlay Market remains the bustling center of farm fresh, locally sourced, artisanal and specialty foods. Findlay Market is home to more than 40 indoor merchants selling meat, fish, poultry, produce, flowers, cheese, deli, and ethnic foods. On weekends from April through November the Market also hosts a thriving farmers market, dozens of outdoor vendors, numerous street performers, and lots of special events.



Kings Island Amusement Park



Located in downtown Cincinnati, it is just a few steps from the banks of the Ohio River, the great natural barrier that separated the slave states of the South from the free states of the North prior to the Civil War.

Fort Ancient is an American Indian hilltop enclosure built nearly 2,000 years ago, situated on a terrace overlooking the Little Miami River. Archaeological excavations have revealed 18,000 feet of well-preserved earthen embankment walls, which enclose ceremonial space.
