

Teams are limited, so don't wait to enter!

OFFICIAL RULES

- * Teams consist of 5 Members.
- * All members of the team must be paid convention attendees.
- * Mobile Phones CANNOT be used to answer questions.
- * No Help from anyone not a member of the team.
- * Teams CANNOT share members and may NOT interact during the competition.
- * Up to 5 teams may compete in the final round at the Christmas festival.
- * If more than 5 teams enter the competition, a Qualification Round will be held at 3 pm on Thursday.
- * Each team must elect a spokesperson who will write the team's final answer on a dry erase board.
- * No charge to compete

ABOUT THE GAME

- * **Four Rounds:** 4 questions each round, 1 halftime question, 1 final question
- * You will get 2 minutes to answer each question and 4 minutes for the halftime and final questions.
- * There will be a five-minute break at the halfway point.
- * Points for correct questions will be awarded as follows:
 - * **Round 1:** each correct answer will receive 2 points.
 - * **Round 2:** each correct answer will receive 2 points.
 - * **Halftime:** The correct answer will receive 5 points.
 - * **Round 3:** each correct answer will receive 4 points.
 - * **Round 4:** each correct answer will receive 4 points.
- * **Final Question:** in Jeopardy type fashion, teams can wager their awarded points, or choose to wager 0 points. Correct answers will award the team their wagered points. Incorrect answers will reduce the team's score.
 - * If you do not know the answer, take a guess. You may get it correct. Teams will not lose points for wrong answers in the main game; they just will not get the points.
 - * The winning team will be the team that finishes with the most points.
 - * If after the final question, the winning teams end in a tie, additional questions will be asked until a winner is determined.
- * Scores will be tabulated at the end of each round.
- * Questions and Answers will be taken from articles in The Glow magazine posted on

- the website and will relate to Christmas, Patriotic decor displayed as Christmas, and New Years decorations. No questions or answers will be taken from the Business sections or the Editors and Chair letters.
- * Since this is a fair competition, please do not use anything besides your own knowledge to answer the questions, not Google, other search engines, books, phone a friend, etc. We want to know what you know for the answers.
- * When discussing answers, teams are encouraged to whisper as any answers overheard are fair game to the other teams.
- * Prizes will be as follows:
 - * First place: In addition to bragging rights, \$100 will be awarded to each member of the winning team, up to \$500
 - * Exciting Prize packs will be awarded to 2nd and 3rd place teams.



The silvery, one-tone aluminum Evergleam trees, produced by the Aluminum Specialty Co. of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, are more familiar with collectors, with some of the more elusive trees being the bi- and tri-color, and the ever-popular pink versions made by a variety of U.S. and Canadian companies.
