

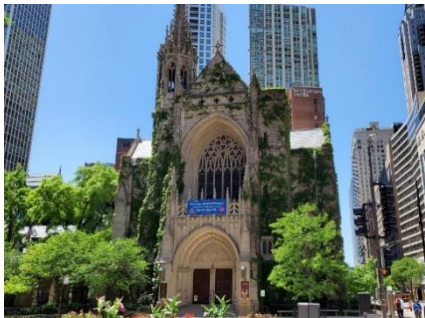
Excursion – Tuesday, August 19, 2025, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Richard Driehaus Museum and Fourth Presbyterian Church



This fascinating tour will leave the hotel at 9:00 a.m. Our first stop will be the Driehaus Museum. This exquisite building was saved twice; first by a collection of over 100 Chicago citizens in 1919 and then by philanthropist Richard Driehaus, who sponsored the restoration from 2003-2008. The museum showcases

art, architecture, and design from the late 19th and early 20th centuries in a meticulously restored Gilded Age home. The museum is closed to the public on Tuesdays, so we will have the full attention of the museum staff. They will be gathering photos of past Christmas displays at the museum for us to view. The building **is handicap accessible**.



After leaving the Driehaus, we will continue to the Fourth Presbyterian Church several blocks west. The church was founded and dedicated on Sunday, October 8, 1871. Within hours, the Church was destroyed by the Great Chicago Fire! We will be guided through the church which was rebuilt and rededicated in 1914. The stained-glass windows were designed by Charles Connick of Boston; Frederick Bartlett was responsible for the Sanctuary

ceiling decorations, including personally painting the rich canvases over the side bays of the Nave. The Nativity is in the lower level and on view 365 days of the year. **Handicap accessible**.

The tour is limited to 55 participants and will be handled on a first come first served basis. No lunch service.
